

## Regional GIS

- Monday, January 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017 a Mid-Shore GIS Committee meeting was held at the Talbot County Public Works building in Easton. Representatives from the ESRGC, City of Cambridge, Dorchester County, Talbot County, Michael Baker Consulting, Eastern Shore Land Conservancy, Queen Anne's County, Kent County, ESRI, and Choptank Electric were present.

Updates were offered regarding recent activities of the counties, non-profits, private industry and ESRGC.

Discussions included:

Blight study underway in City of Cambridge (a collaboration with Department of Geography at Salisbury University), Drone Program and usage in Queen Anne's County, Queen Anne's County meeting with representatives from Tyler Technologies to adopt an ERP software, Drone presentation scheduled for TUGIS 2017 – presenters from Queen Anne's County, Broadband Task Force - RFP put out for fiber that would serve all of Queen Anne's County, Critical Area and Zoning updates in Kent County along with NextGen 911 discussions, Dorchester County upgrading ArcServer from 10.1 – 10.4.1, comp. plan revisions and upgrading apps from Flex to Javascript using the ESRI App Builder, Dorchester County looking to build a new app for Zoning and Permitting along with Parks and Rec mapping support, NextGen911: consultant/subject area expert (Mission Critical) has been assigned with assessing data quality and conformance as well as evaluating software/hardware requirements across the state, MDP discussion for improving parcel data updates and frequency and how counties can get involved in the process. Discussion on how FY18 Rural Maryland Prosperity Fund can assist with GIS related projects and infrastructure needs across the Mid-Shore.
